The La Jolla Tennis Club is a unique part of the La Jolla Recreation Center. The land was donated to the city of San Diego by Ellen Browning Scripps in 1917.

In 2016 the La Jolla Tennis Club will host the 100th Annual La Jolla Tennis Championships. This tournament has the distinction of being the oldest tennis tournament continuously held at the same venue in the United States. Our roster of past participants reads like a who's who in tennis – including our own Dodo Cheney who won our singles event 9 times and has won over 390 national titles.

In preparation for the 100th Annual La Jolla Tennis Championships, we would like to make significant capital improvements to the tennis courts, the Pro Shop, and the surrounding grounds. These improvements would be beyond the scope of general maintenance and upkeep.

Short Term:

- Landscape to reduce water usage
- New storage shed
- Enclose Pro Shop deck (new awning)

Long Term:

- Replace foundation for courts 3 & 4
(current foundation was built in 1917)
- Improve lighting
- New Pro Shop
